Dear Committee 10,

When we are honest about marriage, we know that marriage is a peacemaking issue! That two people commit themselves to living together for the rest of their lives is peacemaking up close and personal. And marriage gives hope that human beings can learn to live together.

The Presbyterian Peace Fellowship senses the hand of God moving through our church to extend the gift of marriage to all persons who seek to enter into this commitment, regardless of their sexual orientation.

PPF does not see this transformation as merely conforming to secular social changes. Rather, we recognize the Holy Spirit in many of these changes. We repent that the church was among the last, not the first, to express the love of God equally to all. The consequences of our past policies have lent endorsement to discrimination, to families turning away from their own, to hate crimes and violence against gay and lesbian human beings.

We realize that not everyone agrees with this change. Therefore the actions proposed below honor freedom of conscience and do not compel any pastor or church to bless or participate in same-sex marriage ceremonies. Discernment will continue as we seek to better understand this gift from God.

As for us, the Presbyterian Peace Fellowship is honored to lend its support and respect to those who have labored long to see justice roll down like waters, cleansing us all of discrimination, separation and fear.

If approved, may this historic change be an occasion for us all to re-commit ourselves to our own relationships and to support others in this miraculous, mysterious peacemaking endeavor that we call marriage.
